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About the UNIMED GENERAL ASSEMBLY



Green innovation and employability through the triple helix: good practices, challenges and perspectives in the Mediterranean region, organised in collaboration with the Union for the Mediterranean

Date: 15 March 02:30 pm - 03:45 pm

The workshop aims to present at regional level (Mediterranean area) the main practices, challenges, and perspectives with regards to the existing policies and instruments that facilitate access to employment of graduates and researchers in the Mediterranean region, highlighting how they could support the development of a sustainable economy through innovation and employability.

The workshop is organised within the framework of the Study that has been commissioned to UNIMED by the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) on "**Green innovation and employability in the Med through the triple helix**" aimed to support UfM in analysing and evaluating strategies, policies, programmes and key projects in three pilot Med countries (Italy, Jordan and Tunisia) by assessing their socio-economic impact, gaps, and bottlenecks on innovating the economies and facilitating employment of young graduates, with the ultimate goal of supporting the shift towards sustainability through the triple helix model of innovation.


The workshop will tackle the following topics:

The complexity of the relationships between youth unemployment, quality of training and the uptake of the green economy;

Raising awareness about the importance of sustainable development choices which is constantly growing among the population, thus making sustainable practices an absolute political priority;

R&I agenda endorsed by the June 2022 Ministerial Declaration: Climate Change, Renewable Energy and Health;

Improving the growth of companies operating in the green economy area, both in terms of production, of consultancy and of design capabilities, to create the conditions for the increase of the number of green jobs;





Adapting the training and education systems in the target countries by reviewing curricula and teaching methodologies to match these with new employment opportunities and with the needs of the labour market.


Mediterranean Digital and Open Education: proposals for the Ministerial Conference declaration, session by the UNIMED SubNetwork on eLearning and Open Education

Date: 15 March 2023 02:30 pm - 3:45 pm

There is a growing sense of being at a tipping point in Higher Education, a time of transformation driven by the increased use of digital technologies, and by multiple economic, political and environmental pressures as the main drivers of change for the new decade. When looking to the future, we envision universities that are innovative and engaged in society while retaining their core values. We envision them embracing Open Education as a way to widen access and participation to everyone by removing barriers and making learning accessible, abundant, and customisable for all.

Nevertheless, digital and Open Education in Higher Education is still seldom a widespread practice, and transitioning to digital education at scale is highly complex even in the best of circumstances. There is a need for a clear vision for and by universities taking a step towards digital transformation, for and by international cooperation among universities, how they want to develop, shape and respond to these challenges over this decade.

This workshop aims to explore the intersection of digital transformation and Open Education





in Higher Education, and it will focus on the vision, challenges and opportunities that digital and Open Education present for the region's educational systems, and on identifying key priorities for action in the region. Participants will discuss the vision which can guide future policies, strategies and initiatives in the region, and engage in discussions on how to harness the potential of digital and Open Education in order to create more inclusive and effective learning environments, as well as the role of regional cooperation in advancing digital and open education.



The European Union programmes to improve cooperation in the Mediterranean Region: Horizon Europe and Erasmus+ programmes

Date: 15 March 03:45 pm – 05:00 pm

Education, research and innovation have an enormous transformational potential in our societies. Education and innovation systems, as the essential pillars for sustainable, inclusive and equitable societies, have a crucial role in promoting equal opportunities, equal access and build employability. Since the Barcelona Euro-Mediterranean Conference in 1995, the EU has stepped up its efforts to achieve our shared objectives of a common area of peace and stability, shared prosperity and social, cultural and human partnership. The international cooperation instruments made available by the EU have largely contributed to creating bridges among peoples and societies, reinforcing scientific dialogue, cultural cooperation, trust, and mutual understanding. EU instruments play a crucial role in building stable and effective relations among European and Southern Mediterranean countries, and education is central to the efforts of the European Union. Academic communities, students, faculty members, administrators, have benefited from a wide range of programmes promoting cooperation, mobility, research, capacity building. The activities undertaken by the Euro-Mediterranean academic community show the value of encouraging and supporting this work, while also seeking more synergies in the light of the current multifaceted dynamics and challenges.

UNIMED is strongly committed to playing a major role in the region, integrating and synergising





key initiatives in research, education, and innovation, as well as in supporting the political dialogue.

In this session, the impact and the opportunities offered by the two most important programmes of the European Commission that support international academic cooperation will be analysed: the Erasmus+ and the Horizon Europe.

Erasmus+ is the EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport in Europe. In particular, the 2021-2027 programme places a strong focus on social inclusion, the green and digital transitions, promoting young people's participation in democratic life and it has an estimated budget which is nearly double the funding compared to its predecessor programme (2014-2020).

Horizon Europe is the EU's key funding programme for research and innovation. It facilitates collaboration and strengthens the impact of research and innovation in developing, supporting and implementing EU policies while tackling global challenges. In particular, it tackles climate change, helps to achieve the UN's Sustainable Development Goals and boosts the EU's competitiveness and growth.



The global dimension of the European University Alliances: opportunities for the Mediterranean partners

The European University Initiative was launched in 2018 and has become a central element of the European Strategy for Universities as a driver of structural, systemic and sustainable transformation of the European university system. Although the initiative has initially addressed European universities belonging to the Erasmus+ programme (as principal funder of the initiative), it is increasingly clear that the global dimension of the alliances is important for their future and for the fulfilment of their mission.





In this session, three European University alliances present their vision of this initiative and how they envisage the role of global partners, in particular from the Southern Mediterranean, in their mission and work plans. The alliances are: Arqus, coordinated by the University of Granada, CHARM-EU, coordinated by the University of Barcelona, CIVIS, coordinated by the University of Aix-Marseille, and UNITE, coordinated by TU Darmstadt and in which the Polytechnic of Turin is a key partner.


Start Cup Competition

The "Start Cup Competition 2023" is jointly organized by UNIMED and by the Lebanese University, coordinator of the UNIMED SubNetwork on Employability, with the collaboration of the University Agency of la Francophonie - Moyen Orient, the European Training Foundation (ETF) and the University of Granada.

This is the 4th edition of the "Start Cup Competition" which is a competition of entrepreneurial ideas developed by university students enrolled in one of the universities around the Mediterranean. This competition aims to encourage participating teams from universities on both shores of the Mediterranean to present innovative ideas in the field of entrepreneurship.

The "Start Cup Competition 2023" follows the Start Cup Competition 2022, 2021 and the RESUME 2018 First Edition which took place in Messina (Italy) as part of the <u>RESUME project</u> and is launched in the framework of the UNIMED SubNetwork on Employability.





Good governance, Academic freedom and University Autonomy in the MENA region: proposals for the Ministerial Conference declaration

Date: 16 March 11:30 am –12:30 pm

One of the key elements of the recent higher education reforms worldwide is university governance.

The concept describes how universities and higher education institutions define their goals, implement them, manage their institutions and monitor their achievements. In particular, in the discourse around governance, concepts such as autonomy, accountability and responsibility rise.

Autonomy concerns the relationship between the institution and the public authorities ruling the Higher Education sector. It measures how freely higher education institutions can take decisions within the regulations shaping each higher education system. Accountability refers to the capacity of each institution in being responsible and held responsible for decisions and actions. Along with autonomy and accountability, universities are demanded to take a stand in society and take responsibility for driving positive changes locally and globally. The path towards good governance is a long-lasting process, which requires a participative approach and the capacity of higher education institutions to adapt, learn, change and be responsive.


Projects and initiatives that highlight a liveliness both of the universities themselves as well as of the political context that assigns to higher education institutions a leading role in the advancement of the weak and fragile economies of the Middle East and North Africa region. Different systems of university governance and quality assurance are now the subject of reform: during this session, we will listen two emblematic cases of reform process, such as Algeria and Tunisia. In addition of these two cases, during the session we approach the concept of academic freedom listening a representative of Scholars at Risk that UNIMED recently joined as a member.



In this framework, this session is intended to deepen the discussion about student's empowerment and to launch opportunities for student mobility, including digital and virtual mobility.

UNIMED is eager to supporting students' engagement, promoting student summits, encouraging mutual invitation to events of common interest, fostering capacity building for students and student leaders, potential policy makers of the future.

Africa Europe Foundation aims to reset the relations between the two continents by building a true partnership and a vision for a shared future. Youth participation, mobility, and employability are core values which associate Africa Europe Foundation with UNIMED.


Showcase of UNIMED priorities and conversations with UNIMED team


